COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Description: Web site creation with graphic elements. Includes use of Web authoring software and study of websites and browsers. Create and manage standards-compliant web pages that include images, links, Flash elements, interactive behaviors, and forms. Speed development by using Library items and Templates. Use built-in FTP feature to upload sites to a remote server. **Prerequisites:** Introduction to WWW Authoring and XHTML.

Course Objectives: Every student will be able to:

- Use and manipulate the Dreamweaver workspace
- Format text using CSS
- Build tables
- Create forms
- Insert images
- Use Dynamic HTML
- Work with behaviors, templates, libraries

Rationale: Adobe Dreamweaver is the industry standard web editor. From its sophisticated support for Dynamic HTML and JavaScript, to its clean, compliant XHTML code, Dreamweaver integrates well with other web development applications including Flash and Photoshop. In this course, you gain a solid understanding of this powerful tool and its capabilities by actually building several web sites, and posting them online.

Required Materials: None.

Type of Course: Short course
